


The site of Castlecary fort can be accessed from the village of Castlecary. Take a minor road marked 'Walton' which runs south from the Bonnybridge to Castlecary road B816. Park in a cul-de-sac left off Walton Road, close to the former schoolhouse (now residential). The site of the fort can be seen in a field, marked by a clump of trees. Traces of some of the ramparts can still be seen.

It is the responsibility of teachers and group leaders to complete a risk assessment prior to any site visit with a group. This is a requirement of most education authorities. The following information is intended as a preparatory tool and does not replace a teacher's or group leader's own risk assessment.

Please be aware that changes in weather may affect the risks inherent in an outdoor site. Pupils should dress for outdoors.
