

The Carrick stone is the only
Roman altar remaining in the
open air in Scotland. It can be found
within railings around 100m along
a footpath running south-west from
Portland Road, off Carrickstone Road,
Cumbernauld close to two water
towers. On-street parking on
Portland Road.
