

HAZARD INFORMATION FOR TEACHERS BEARSDEN: BATH-HOUSE

The well-preserved remains of a Roman bath-house and latrine, built to serve a small fort can be seen on Roman Road, Bearsden, Glasgow.

The site is signed from Bearsden Cross on A810 and lies approximately 600m down Roman Road. Free car parking is available 300m west along Roman Road from the site.

It is the responsibility of teachers and group leaders to complete a risk assessment prior to any site visit with a group. This is a requirement of most education authorities. The following information is intended as a preparatory tool and does not replace a teacher's or group leader's own risk assessment.

Please be aware that changes in weather may affect the risks inherent in an outdoor site. Pupils should dress for outdoors.



POTENTIAL HAZARDS AT BEARSDEN

PEDESTRIAN ACCESS TO SITE

- Risk from moving cars in the car park.
- Pupils should be closely supervised walking along the pavement to the site: the road is busy and fast here.

EXTERNAL HAZARDS

- Grass and stone slabs within site area can become slippery in wet weather.
- Trip risk from low walls, uneven surfaces, cobbling and wooden posts.
